Note: All American Community Survey Data are published with margins of error at the 90% confidence level. The data contained in the 2005-2009 5-year American Community Survey (ACS) are based on the ACS sample through interviews from 01/01/05-12/31/09. ACS estimates are period estimates that describe the average characteristics of population and housing over the 5 year period of data collection. Multiyear estimates cannot be used to say what is going on in any particular year in the period, only what the average value is over the full period. The ACS sample is selected from all counties and county-equivalents in the U.S.. The ACS, like any other statistical activity, is subject to error.
